  - U7 Groups split into three teams mainly by age (2015, 2016, 2017)
  - Approx. 115 kids enrolled
  - Tried to keep groups small for a better experience for the kids

  - One hundred fifty one kids on 14 teams
  - Three A teams, 8 B teams, 3 C teams
  - Half ice "regular" season which included regular BMHL games on Sundays, tournament and exhibition games

# Season Re-cap - VP Hockey Operations Report

- ► First post-COVID-19
  - Lost some "institutional" knowledge
    - Need pre-season meetings: coaches, managers and new season updates
  - Purchased new practice jerseys, some new goalie equipment, ran out of some socks in some sizes, ran out of WEHL pucks, and many game jerseys are past-life

## VP Hockey Operations Report

- BMHL balance
  - Ideally all association teams should have an approximately equal chance of losing and winning. Target of .400-.600
  - Rarely occurs
    - Structural issues: 2:6:2 target if association large enough
    - Evaluation policy: Excluding 1st year form A in U9-U15
      - Pain to enforce.
      - WEHL is the only association in BMHL to do this.
  - Two year pilot WEHL will adopt the same evaluation policy as the rest of BMHL in order to answer two questions:
    - Does this have any effect on BMHL parity?
    - Does this make life easier for coaches and convenors?

# Season Re-cap - VP Volunteers Report

#### Key activities this past season:

- Working with equipment manager / recruiting volunteers to sort / repair jerseys
- Working with VP Junior / Intermediate to recruit and onboard new convenors for several age groups (IP5, U11, U13)
- Supporting convenors with finding sort-out evaluators and coaches
- Responding to inquiries from coaches and trainers about completing qualifications

#### Suggestions for improvement next year:

- Confirm convenors for all divisions by mid-August
- ▶ Identify gaps for sort-out evaluators and coaches by end-August
- ▶ Get back to having the start-of-season volunteers meeting in early September



# Season Re-cap - VP Risk & Safety Report

- ► 50+ coaches, assistants, managers and Trainers received their PRC's this year.
- Two major changes at Risk & Safety:
  - Green-arm band: Protecting our youngest officials, supplementary for any infraction against an official wearing a green arm-band.
  - 11.4 maltreatment Gross Misconduct
     Discriminatory grounds include the following, without limitation:
    - Race, national or ethnic origin, skin colour or language spoken;
    - Religion, faith or beliefs;
    - Age; Sex, sexual orientation or gender identity / expression;
    - Marital or familial status;
    - Genetic characteristics;
    - Disability





# Season Re-cap - VP Ice Report

#### Report on Past season (2021-22) and Ice related issues

- Solid start of season but Covid caused the wheels to fall off by the Xmas break and we had to adjust.
- Most teams received their fair share of ice (2hr per week), issued refunds to teams that were short changed
- Ice Allocation on budget City of Ottawa stepped up to help us.

#### Next season (2022-23)

- Cost of ice will be increased by ~2% (\$213.70 per hour)
- Budgeting for 2 hours of half ice per week for each team same
- COVID restrictions might still be in place increasing cost per ice per player from "normal" years.
- City/OPH COVID response forcing us & Bytown into non-traditional arenas - expect that to be better for next season.

#### Financial Highlights

- 2020-21 Season (audited)
  - Pandemic bubble format
  - Revenue \$225K; \$218K expenses
    - Costs lower than normal due to COVID-19 closures and restrictions
  - Unqualified audit





#### Financial Highlights

- 2021-22 Season (unaudited)
  - More "normal" year
  - Revenue \$632,850 (projected)
  - Expenses \$560,628 (projected)
  - Difference \$72K (projected)
  - Major expenses: ice, officials, jerseys/socks, goalie equipment, finances
  - COVID-19 closure rebates
  - Skate sharpening booth and canteen





#### 2022-23 Budget Overview

- Projections (excludes Golden Knights ice)
  - Revenue of \$590,170
  - Expenses of \$600,708
  - Total deficit \$10,500
- Budgeted 870 players
- Budgeted for a regular season with early registration period
- Regular events planned (e.g., coaches/managers meeting; year-end banquet)
