#### Registrar Report

• For the 2022/23 season, Hockey Canada implemented a new registration system (HCR 3.0) and made mandatory self identification related to ethnicity, including requesting that members indicate whether they identify as Indigenous.



- Registration will open on June 5 and discounted Early Bird registration will run from June 5-23.
  - Players trying out for competitive are NOT eligible for the discounted fee.
- A new half-season session is planned for U5s (kids born in 2019); however, it will depend on registration and volunteer numbers.
- Consistent with 2022/23, WEHL-catchment players who intend to try out for competitive teams (OWGK, Sting, Junior 67s, etc.), are not required to pay any fees to WEHL before their competive try outs.
  - However, also consistent with 2022/23, players are required to be registered for competitive through the WEHL registration system before trying out for a competitive team.
  - Players must also be registered (and their fees paid) with the highest-level competitive level team for which they intend to try out before the competive association's registration deadline. Competitive associations usually have discounted early bird fees so we encourage you to stay informed of their registration processes to benefit from any discount.
  - If unsuccessful in competitive tryouts, players need to be registered (and their fees paid) with WEHL (House League) before attending WEHL sort outs.



- WEHL members (players, parents and volunteers) continue to be responsible for updating their HCR profiles and completing mandatory fields in order to be eligible for rostering.
- Members who intend to volunteer for the 2023/24 season should ensure that their Vulnerable Sector Check (VSC) has been done on or after November 15, 2020 or it may expire prior to the completion of rostering. VSCs are only valid for three years and will need to be updated mid-season if they expire.

## VP Risk & Safety Report

- 59 coaches, assistants, managers and Trainers received their PRC's this year.
  - Issue HC requires these to be updated into HCR for approval to team list. Limitation R&S has no access to HCR or team lists.
- HEO discipline changes:
  - 11.4 maltreatment Gross Misconduct
    - Discriminatory grounds race, religion, sexuality, genetic characteristics. Has been very broadly interpreted.
    - Appears mandatory hearing will be dropped, mandatory 5 games will still apply. Likely HEO will institute a mechanism to hold a hearing in the event of an egregious violation.



#### VP Ice Report

- Report on Past season (2022-2023) and ice related issues
  - Challenging year due to BMHL approach to games scheduling
  - Practices largely during the week and hours consistent for each age-group
- All teams received more ice beyond their minimum required allocation
- First year for current VP Ice so some learning curve issues
- Next season (2023-2024)
  - Cost of ice will be increased by ~2% (\$219 / hour)
  - Budgeting for 2 hours of half ice per week for each team same
  - Several hours / week will be set aside for open development sessions
  - BMHL will be looking at better ways to plan games that aren't weekend-focused
  - Practice allocation is only confirmed once BMHL has confirmed games schedule
  - More accurate planning for ice allocation based on previous years' numbers

#### Financial Highlights

- 2022-23 Season (unaudited)
  - Regular season
  - Revenue \$714,170; expenses \$811,300 (projected)
  - Still in surplus position
  - Major expenses: ice, development, HEO fees, officials, sweaters/socks, canteen; extra sweaters
  - Inflation and COVID



- 2022-23 Season (unaudited)
  - Donations: registration; Julie Dunnigan;
     YE banquet raffle
  - Donated \$2100 to Youth Services Bureau



#### 2023-24 Budget Overview

- Projections (excludes Golden Knights ice)
  - 902 players
  - Revenue of \$821K
  - Expenses of \$864K
  - Total deficit \$43K
- Budgeted for a larger than normal deficit to keep registration fees low; drawing down on surplus



- Expenses continue to increase
- Development for players and goalies, coaches included
- Evaluation for U9-U13 and conditioning sessions for all levels
- Continue to replace jerseys, improve goalie equipment, support canteen
