

 - Socks (blue for next season)




Volunteers Report



Risk & Safety Report

Vulnerable Sector Check (VSC) - Ottawa Police

- 108 coaches, assistants, managers and Trainers received VSC's.
- Hockey Canada requires VSC's to be updated into HCR for approval to team list.

Updates:

- Most common discipline issues this year remains <u>discriminatory slurs</u>.

Ice Report

2024-2025 Season Report and ice related issues

- Challenges with limited practice ice for some divisions due to BMHL scheduling approach (too much ice was taken for games)
- Playoff challenges in U18 due to new format that scheduled games with limited notice
- Availability of extra ice continues to be an issue across the city.

Next season (2024-2025)

- Cost of ice increase from \$224.80/hr to \$231.44/hr
- Budgeting for 2 hours of half ice per week for each team same
- Several hours / week will be set aside for development sessions
- Trialing new software for ice allocation and will allocate ice to BMHL for games (rather than having BMHL select the ice times they want)

Registration 2025/2026 Season

- Opens June 9
- Early Bird registration will run from June 9-27, 2025.
- Players still planning to try out for Rep B are **NOT** eligible for the discounted early bird fees.

• A once-a-week session (Saturday mornings) is planned for U5s (kids born in 2021); however, like recent years, it will depend on registration and volunteer numbers, so interested families should get the word out.

Competitive Tryouts

- WEHL catchment players intending to try out for Rep B (Ottawa West Golden Knights) are not required to pay any fees to WEHL before their Rep B tryouts.
- WEHL catchment players who intend to try out for Rep B OR who have already been successful in competitive tryouts for the 2025-2026 season must register for WEHL competitive through the WEHL registration system.
 - Competitive registration with WEHL is free
- Players must also register (and pay fees) with the Ottawa West Golden Knights before OWGK's registration deadline.
- If players are unsuccessful in competitive tryouts, players must be registered and have fees paid for WEHL (House League) before attending WEHL sort outs in September 2025.



Hockey Canada Register Profiles

 WEHL members (players, parents and volunteers) continue to be responsible for completing their qualifications, updating their HCR profiles, and completing mandatory fields in order to be eligible for rostering.

Volunteer Qualifications

- Members who intend to volunteer for the 2025/26 season should ensure that they have the following qualifications at a minimum (trainers/coaches require more):
 - Vulnerable Sector Check (VSC) completed on or after November 15, 2022
 - If VSC was completed prior to November 15, 2022, it may expire prior to the completion of rostering. VSCs are only valid for three years and will need to be updated mid-season if they expire. Email VP Risk to request a letter that waives the fee with the City of Ottawa Police.
 - Respect in Sport for ACTIVITY LEADERS
 - This course is different than the PARENTS version and needs to be completed and showing under the volunteer's Qualifications tab in their Hockey Canada profile prior to the start of the season.
 - Gender Identity and Expression Course
 - This course needs to be completed and showing under the volunteer's Qualifications tab in their Hockey Canada profile prior to the start of the season.



Bylaw Amendment

Proposed addition to the Bylaws:

The board would like to add the following text to the bylaws:

A Board member may have his or her position declared vacant by a majority vote of the Board should the Board member fail to attend two (2) consecutive Board meetings, or three (3) Board meetings during the West End Hockey year. The Board acknowledges that the strong preference is for Board members to attend Board meetings in-person. In exceptional circumstances, including, without limitation, travel, the Board shall employ its best efforts to allow Board members to attend Board meetings online or by telephone.
